


### **Mission**

# The Community We Serve

Westminster's holistic approach to serving the entire family is important to the many neighbors that come through the doors annually. The relationship built with the families is so important; at times we might be the only ones cheering on these families and helping them navigate hard situations they face daily.

With 28% of the neighborhood living below the poverty level and experiencing barriers that they need help overcoming, Westminster's services are essential to help families break down those barriers and break free from the obstacles holding them back in life.





### **Youth Services**

At Westminster, we believe that when we invest in our youngest neighbors, we're investing in the future of our entire community.

In 2024, our youth programming had a profound impact on 77 students, providing them with 960 hours of academic support and enrichment. By equipping young minds with the tools they need to succeed, we are not just supporting their immediate needs—we are building a foundation for their long-term success and contributing to the growth of a brighter, stronger community.

Our commitment to youth development also extends to ensuring that every child has the resources they need to succeed in school. This year, 591 children received the school supplies essential to start their academic year with confidence and readiness. Whether it's a backpack full of essentials or the encouragement provided through our enrichment programs, Westminster is dedicated to empowering the next generation to thrive, both in and out of the classroom.

# **Adult & Family Services**

In 2024, Westminster's outreach efforts spanned far and wide, with a total of 37,644 touchpoints across all our programs.

Westminster's food programs remain a cornerstone of our services, providing life-changing support for those battling food insecurity. In 2024, we served 21,785 meals, ensuring families had access to nutritious options when they needed them most. Additionally, our senior pantry helped 717 seniors.

Beyond food, we continue to offer holistic support for families, addressing the challenges of poverty with services that include educational assistance, health resources, and emergency aid. These programs offer a sense of hope, empowering families to overcome obstacles and build a brighter future.

These efforts were made possible by the dedication of 581 unique volunteers, who collectively contributed 6,927 hours of service. Their selfless work and commitment helped bring vital resources and support to families facing difficult circumstances.

## Our Impact is Your Impact.

At Westminster Neighborhood Services, we are driven by our mission to provide educational support, access to basic needs, and foster community connections.

A new family came to a Tuesday evening pantry. They had never had to utilize a food pantry and was very unsure of the process and how they would be treated. They talked with our Case Manager and they told our team how money just wasn't stretching as far as it use to and they need help.

They were signed up for Diapers through the Indiana Diaper Bank, added to the Afterschool program waitlist, and was connected to IU Student Health Center for medical needs they had. They left Westminster telling staff how grateful they were for the assistance.

In 2024, our programs made a profound impact, reaching more than **5,900 neighbors** through over 37,000 touchpoints. We remain committed to uplifting families on the Near Eastside of Indianapolis by offering the resources and support they need to thrive, especially in times of hardship.

**1,154 new neighbors** joined our community, marking a year of growth and connection. The care, support and services provided ensured that each individual received the attention and access to resources they needed.










