NEIGHBOR STORY

Miss Julia* is a neighbor and longtime regular at Westminster's food pantry. She has been working through physical and mental health challenges for many years, and has stayed connected both with Westminster's case manager, Takeisha, as well as a team at a mental health service provider

In December, Miss Julia was hospitalized due to abnormal blood sugar levels related to diabetes and exacerbated by stress. At the hospital, Miss Julia's condition made it difficult for her to provide information about herself and her health history to her care team. Even so, Miss Julia was able to share Takeisha's number, telling them that she knew Takeisha could help.

On the phone with the hospital care team, Takeisha shared information about Miss Julia and connected them with her mental health service provider to ensure she received holistic support. Once discharged, Miss Julia returned to Westminster and met with Takeisha, who helped her catch up on rent payments, shop in the food pantry, and make a plan to better manage her stress and diabetes in the future.

Miss Julia's story illustrates the trust between the Westminster team and our neighbors. Alongside helping people meet their basic needs, we have also created a consistent, supportive environment that helps individuals address other barriers affecting their ability to thrive.

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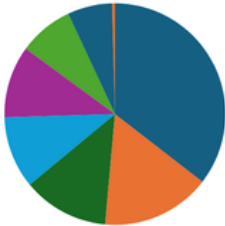

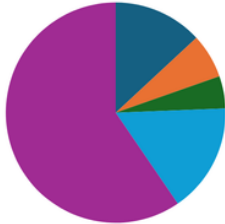

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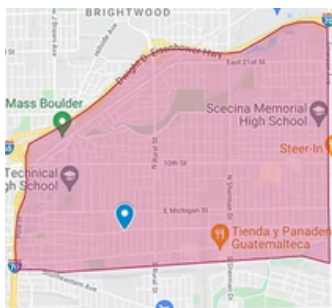

THE COMMUNITY WE SERVE

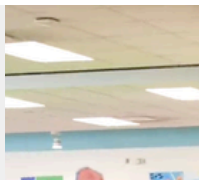
Westminster is a welcoming community space where neighbors can show up just as they are. We prioritize building relationships, and at times might be the only ones helping our neighbors navigate hard situations.

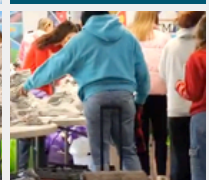

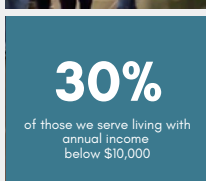
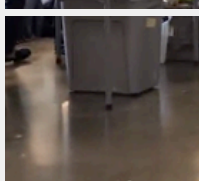
